## THE ORDER OF THE HOLY COMMUNION


A NOTE TO OUR VISITORS: We rejoice in having you share with us our Lord's gift of His grace to us through His Word. The Lord's Supper is celebrated in the service today. God's Word directs us that only those who are sufficiently instructed to examine themselves that they might recognize the body of Christ in the Sacrament (1 Cor. 11:28-29) should partake thereof. The members of Trinity Lutheran Church believe and confess the real presence of the incarnate Lord Jesus in His body and blood in and under the bread and wine of His Supper, discerning that the bread is a communion of the true body of Christ, and the wine is a communion of the true blood of Christ (1 Cor. 10:16). Such "communion" testifies to the unity of faith among all those who partake (1 Cor. 10:17). This presupposes unity in both doctrine and confession (Acts 2:42). If you are a communicant member in good standing of a congregation of The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod or The American Association of Lutheran Churches, fellowship with us is a given, "sufficient instruction" is assumed. Therefore, you are invited to join us at the Lord's Table. If you are a fellow-believer of another denomination not in confessional fellowship with us, yet desiring to commune, we kindly request that, prior to communing, you speak with the pastor concerning your participation in the Lord's Supper.

### INVOCATION AND CALL TO WORSHIP

#### Stand

- P Jesus repeatedly told his disciples what lay ahead for him. It was the purpose for which he had come. Calling himself the Son of Man, a title for the Messiah from the prophet Daniel, Jesus said, "The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day" (Matthew 17:22-23).
- Teach us, Lord, to follow you in faithfulness.
- P As the time drew near for Jesus to finish his earthly ministry and to be taken up to heaven, he turned to Jerusalem and to the cross: "When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem." (Luke 9:51)
- When our days are difficult and challenging, Lord Jesus, help us to keep our focus on you.
- P As Jesus began to take his final steps toward the cross, he said, "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name" (John 12:27-28).

Jesus, in faithfulness, you took up the cross for the sake of our salvation. Set your cross before us to guide us to persevere in faith.

### **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

- **P** Let us then confess our sins to God, and ask his forgiveness.
- Almighty God, we are called to persevere in our obedience to your will and your ways, but instead we sin against you. We do not walk in your ways or love others as we should. We are more interested in fulfilling our own desires than serving others and being faithful to your Word. Have mercy on us, and forgive our sins.
- P God, in his mercy, sent his Son to deliver us. Jesus faithfully obeyed his Father's will and suffered and died to save us. I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the → Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- **C** Lord, lead us to walk faithfully in your ways.

So they took Jesus, <sup>17</sup>and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. <sup>18</sup>There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them. <sup>19</sup>Pilate also wrote an inscription and put it on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." <sup>20</sup>Many of the Jews read this inscription, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and it was written in Aramaic, in Latin, and in Greek. <sup>21</sup>So the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but rather, 'This man said, I am King of the Jews." <sup>22</sup>Pilate answered, "What I have written I have written."

#### **Nicene Creed**

and the life 


